DIRECTOR'S REPORT

News Flash!

Ruling Reached on PAT vs AHA Lawsuit

A 22-page ruling on the Purebred Arabian Trust vs Arabian Horse Association lawsuit, which was initiated by the PAT, was handed down by Judge Elizabeth Beebe Volz. The Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Judgement settle the dispute between the two associations. The suit related to which organization owned the \$2.8 million Horse Registration System (HRS) software developed and paid for by AHA. On September 19, 2018 the judge ruled that HRS was not a part of the "licensed technology agreement" and, therefore, is owned solely by AHA.



Another key issue was whether the contract work AHA does for the Canadian Arabian Horse Registry (CAHR) is subject to royalty payments to the PAT. Again, the court ruled against the PAT, stating "the Association is not using either the database or the Licensed Technology to perform services associated with registrations on behalf of the Canadian group."

There were counterclaims by AHA against PAT trustees over Breach of Contract and Covenant Good Faith and Fair Dealing, Unjust Enrichment, Breach of Fiduciary Duty, and Civil Conspiracy. These counterclaims were denied once it became clear AHA had not been damaged when it did not lose ownership of the HRS software.

Finally, the judge ruled in favor of the Trust finding that AHA is required to provide a functioning version of software capable of registering Purebred Arabian horses and AHA is required to maintain the database for such registrations. AHA continues to maintain the database for the registration of Purebred Arabian horses.

AHA Executive Vice President Glenn Petty stated, "After two years in litigation, exchanging 13,000 pages of discovery items, 250 courtroom exhibits, hours and hours of depositions, and eight days in court, it is great to receive this ruling."

"With the end of this lawsuit, we can now move on and work together to promote the Arabian, Half-Arabian and Anglo-Arabian horse," said AHA President Nancy Harvey.

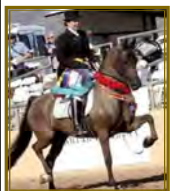

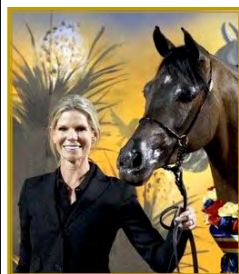

Director's Message*

I will give some briefs about conversations during the meeting and information that I feel you need to be aware of...much of it is business information that for most is not that important – we seem to be more interested in the future of AHA, the promotion of the Arabian, our shows, sweepstakes, etc. So, most will be bullet points – if you have specific questions, please feel to contact me and I will respond with what I can to clarify any issue.

Our meeting was held from 8 am till pm on Friday, which made for a long day and by the end, we all felt a little “brain dead”... however much was discussed and ideas shared. We welcomed several newly elected Directors and it was nice to have them with us...and we met again on Saturday.

Presidents Report:

Arabian industry largest affiliate per budget

USEF/AHA requiring Safe Sport Training – biggest focus now - lots of exhibitor info available

Youth Nationals Convention doubled their attendance numbers

Social media suggestion to all Directors – please encourage your members to put out positive remarks about volunteers, staff, shows, etc, negative remarks do not help

An Ad Hoc committee is being formed to look at how other breeds plan and promote shows/activities

Check out the AHA web page for convention information, etc

Stan Morey – Judge update

269 AHA judges, 161 national and R rated, 102 stewards, 7 for competitive rides and 12 for endurance – need to encourage more participation for judges to train and become one...

Leslie Lockerd – Competitions – If your “off site” regional show is less than 150 horses, it may qualify as a value show...some did not think this was a good idea, discussion followed. Concerns were proper equipment, etc with no steward required

Brad Short– Finance

Challenges with legal fees with the AHA/PAT lawsuit, but managing

Regional and Membership running as expected – slight rise on registrations. Financials handled well first quarter without having to borrow from our savings

AHA April, 2018, Board Meeting

Just want to share a little of the information received at the BOD meeting – ideas, exchanges, discussions, etc...think it is important that you all are aware of what is happening.

President, Nancy Harvey has asked us to not participate in anything relating to AHA/horse industry/persons in a negative manner. The EPRB will be participating in this...we have to remember that as members we actually are a representative of AHA.

New AD HOC committees have been established by President Nancy Harvey:
Show Commission Review
Regional Review
Grass Roots Committee to work with MDP to try and grow the local industry

Cash flow during the early part of the year is down due to limited number of shows during this time. In the past 9 years the savings account has grown from \$0 to \$1 million. There is \$7.3 million in the Sweepstakes Funds.

For those who haul horses, the latest info on licensing can be found on the American Horse Council website...they are working very hard on our behalf.

If anyone has any questions about their Regional accounts, please ask for Rachael Mears at the AHA office.

Leslie Lockard reported that there were the following shows: 36 Value shows, 34 One day shows, 155 AHA shows, 32 Regional Show and 15 Local rides.

MDP: The “Goldie” project to this date has sold 15 statues – most going to provide monies for charity.

Registration Commission will hold a Breeders Forum at Region 12 in September at Aljassimya Farm in Santa Ynez.

At Convention there will be more education opportunities, including the use of Social Media, etc. and things that we can utilize that do not cost money.

Many Regions are cutting costs by forgoing a program at the show, or cutting the number that they print since they find many of them left or tossed in the trash at the end of the show – they are putting them online. And, most are no longer live streaming the show due to the cost which is added to the exhibitor – and issues at the show with the company that does the live stream.

Breeding/Gelding In-hand

The committee discussed striking "show" from number one and putting this proposal through the AHA Resolution process. Following discussion, Ms. Clinton moved to approve as amended, seconded by Ms. Henderson. Motion passed.

Rule Change Proposals

Green Working Hunter – Ms. Hollowed explained that the proposal came from the Hunter group with the desire to further change the rules of this section as the recently approved AHA resolution was not going to accomplish the original desire of the group. Following discussion, Ms. Henderson made a motion to table the proposal, seconded by Mr. Ryan. Motion passed. The committee tasked Ms. Hollowed with reaching out to the group to gather more information as to why they wanted to make additional changes prior to resolution 11-17 going into effect.

Trail Horse/Trail In-hand

Following review of the proposed changes,

Schroeder-Brown moved to approve, seconded by Mr. Cerniga. Motion passed.

Hunter Pleasure Half Cheek Snaffle

Following discussion, the committee decided to clarify that both full and half cheek snaffles are permissible in Hunter Pleasure classes, except in Jr. horse classes where only the full cheek snaffles are permissible. Mr. Schroeder-Brown moved to put these change forward as a clarification, seconded by Mr. Ryan. Motion passed.

Wrapping Western bits with electrical type

Following discussion, it was noted that the use of electrical tape is not legal and addition of the word "only" in AR144 was necessary to clarify that only latex can be used. Mr. Cerniga moved to put the change forward as a clarification, seconded by Mr. Ryan. Motion passed.

AR218 Cutting

Ms. Hollowed explained that the current language does not clearly outline what rules are followed and where they are located. Ms. Schroeder-Brown moved to table the discussion in order to reach out to the AHA Working Western group, seconded by Mr. Cerniga. Motion passed.

Blood Rule

Following discussion of the current language, the committee determined no change was necessary at this time. Mr.

Cerniga moved to leave the rule as is, seconded by Mr. Clinton. Motion passed. Committee requested to re-review this rule periodically throughout the year.
